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When opening a health center, there is no one path that is termed as the true way towards doing so in an advantageous manner. Some health facilities operate without ever getting national funds, or they choose to get the funding years later after they are established. Regardless of what type of health care facility one is opening, it is important to consider the community's needs. This issues may include access, barriers and health status; support level or resistance likely to be experienced in the community, ways to gain the support of the community, the health facility's ability to nurture and develop the governance of the community and the availability of resources and organization of the community. It is important to determine whether the community has designations for federal shortage or whether the community qualifies a health facility to be opened. It is also important to assess the available financing options that will help in the opening of the health facility. The nurse will also require understand the efforts that will be required to get the necessary tasks for starting the medical care facility. Cultural norms and the need of self-determination from the community should also be observed.

Nurse Kowal will need to get a grant under section 330 of the public health service Act. This grant will enable her get cost based reimbursement for the services she provides to Medicare patient. This grant will also allow her to obtain prescription drugs with significant discounts. It will also allow her to access the National Health Care Services (NHCS) resources and providers and the National Vaccine Program for Children in addition to other legal benefits. She will also be required to meet the statutory requirements for attaining the grant according to section 330 guidelines. Even though she will not receive actual grant money, she will be qualified to take advantage of all the benefits that 330 grantees enjoy.

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Nurse Kowal needs to keep her health care facility's core values flexible through processes of community participation since this facility has constituents, clients and customers who greatly influence how work is received and accomplished. She should be flexible in order to cater for all the needs of different people she deals with. She should conduct and manage activities of community engagement. This process of community engagement involves working through and with the constituencies in order to achieve common objectives. Communicating with members of the community as well as its leaders is important as it offers a platform for understanding differing concerns, priorities, values, and backgrounds. Through this, the concepts and principles that are carried out when organizing the engagement with the community will help her get in touch with what happens at the ground. Nurse Kowal should also bring health promotion activities to the community members who need the mobilization of the existing assets of the community, and the institution. She can also engage in social responsibility in the community where she sets up her facility. She can engage in activities like cleaning the environment and making sure that there is no stagnant water for example and this will help in preventing water borne diseases and diseases like malaria.

I do not think that Nurse Kowal's father was wrong since he did not understand how health care must work. Being a businessperson, he understood very well how business works and what needs to be done to make a business successful. Flexibility is important when establishing any type of successful business. Any business requires having some form of flexibility for it to be successful. Making the core values and purposes of the health facility rigid will not provide success.
